


In this lesson you will learn how sew a button and make a button hole using the sliding button hole foot, that comes along with the sewing machine.









The materials required are a piece of fabric, flat buttons with 4 holes, water soluble marker, seam ripper, scale, beaded pins and the sliding button hole foot.

To start with get a piece of fabric that is 10 inches by 10 inches

Place the scale at the center of the fabric and mark a point 1' inside from the edge on either side of the fabric.

Place the button on the point on the left side. And mark two points vertically on either sides of the button at 1/8th inch distance. Then connect these three points with a straight line to mark your buttonhole length.

Now let's start with making the buttonhole.


To attach the buttonhole foot, raise the needle by moving the balance wheel towards you, lift the pressure foot and release the attached A foot by raising the lever. Align the buttonhole foot and clamp it by lowering the lever.

Set the fabric underneath the foot at the start point of the buttonhole marking. Move the slider toward you and lower the foot. The top arrow mark on the slider should meet the start mark on the fabric.









Now raise the needle and set the pattern selector dial at 2. Sew a few stitches and stop sewing.

Now raise the needle and set the pattern selector dial at 3. Start sewing backward until the needle reaches the previous marking of buttonhole.

Raise the needle and set the pattern selector dial at 4. Sew few stitches and then stop sewing.

Lift the foot to remove the fabric. Cut the thread with the help of the thread cutter. the fabric.


Trim off excess thread on the either sides of


Now to stitch the button on the other end of the fabric.


Bring down the feed dog position so as to attach button to the fabric. Raise the foot & remove the extension table. Open the cover where you install the bobbin, to drop the feed dog push the lever to the right-side.

Now close the cover and fix the extension table you are ready. Adjust the front edge of the foot slider with the front rows of the buttonholes & set the button under the foot adjusting the marked position. Lower the foot down.

Keeping the needle raised, set the pattern selector dial at C to sew zig zag stitch. Turn the balance wheel manually towards you, to ensure the needle enters into each hole of the button. Sew a few stitches to sew through the first row of button holes.








Remove the fabric with the attached button and trim all extra thread from both the sides. You are nearly done.

Now take a pin and pin the top of the buttonhole. Using the seam ripper gently cut through the opening. The pin on the top will stop you from over cutting. Remove the pin from the fabric.



Now the button is fixed and the buttonhole is ready. All you need to do is fold the cloth and pass the button through the buttonhole.

Keep practicing button fixing and buttonholing till you are confident. It is easy and only needs a steady hand and a little practice.
